To make a short story shorter we got some new baby chicks. We got two breeds that lays chocolate brown eggs called Cuckoo Marans & Welsummers. They are very cute and friendly and attract every child in the neighborhood between the ages of 2 & 14.

Pond Evolution

Moving ahead with the rock work



After 2 years we have finally given our pond a facelift. We had to remove all the fish, frogs and pollywogs and place them into a temporary pond (1/2 wine barrel) and they seem to enjoy it there.

The Buddha is our final touch sitting above the waterfall. We will fill the area around the pond with stone from Sonoma Mountain, and landscape with many lush green plants. When the PH of the water is balanced we will add Koi and a few water lilies.

New 'On-Demand' Water Heater



After a huge amount of red tape and trench digging we got natural gas running to our house. We were then able to remove our electric hot water heater which ran our bill through the roof. This new on-demand water heater will lower our cost and use fewer resources.

We also added a filter system to the house. A sediment pre-filter pulls out all the small rocks which have been clogging our faucets and an 'activated carbon' filter removes VOC's (volatice organic compounds) and the iron taste from the water. Now it is just like drinking spring water out of the faucet.

The Well House Remodel

This well house was falling over when we moved here. We put a new roof on last year and then added an 'irrigation shed' to the back side of the building. We placed recycled cedar shingles on it to give a rustic feel.



In a couple years you will not be able to even see this building. We hope to plant it with vines and shrubs in such a way that it melts into the garden. We'll keep you posted on the evolution.

Nearby, we hope to build a small compound of 3 strawbale structures. These will act as guest cottages....so come visit!

The Great Sebastopol Blueberry Rescue



Yes, we were part of history. In the last hot dusty days of August hundreds of people descended on the oldest blueberry farm in California to dig up the 54- year old bushes. All of the 500 bushes were rescued from the bulldozer and planted at their new homes in more than 300 gardens around the state.

We were able to get 10 of these to plant at Catchtail Gardens. We can only hope they survive the 90 - 100 degree F temps which have been scorching us every day since.
